



Important Notes about APPI President Elect Nominations:

1. To be eligible for nomination as President Elect, the member must be a Registered Professional Planner (RPP) member of the Institute.
2. Nominees must be RPP members of APPI "in good standing". "In good standing" means member fees for the current year are fully paid and all requirements for the maintenance of membership are satisfied.
3. Nominees for President Elect should have previous experience on APPI Council, possess strong leadership skills, be a confident public speaker and have a high level of discretion, political acumen and relationship building skills
4. All Nominees must be Endorsed by two regulated members of the Institute in good standing.
5. Nomination forms must be submitted to the APPI Office on or before **February 26, 2026** and may be submitted by email to admin@albertaplanners.com attention Nominating Committee.
