THE INDIGENOUS SEVEN INCLUDE:

Daphne Odjig (1919-2016), a mentor for many and master of color and story. Alex Janvier (1935-2024) whose paintings depict delicate lines and with an understanding of color and form that are otherworldly. Norval Morrisseau's (1932-2007) paintings are full of the natural world, shaman wisdom and color from the House of Invention. The spiritual interrogation of legends by Carl Ray (1943-1978), whose time with us was short, but who inspired us to look with a new understanding. The unique abstraction of Jackson Beardy (1944-1984), the sensitive portrayal of nature by Eddy Cobiness (1933-1996), and the surreal dreaming of Joseph Sanchez (b. 1948).

This exhibition is curated by Joseph Sanchez, the last surviving member of the Indigenous Seven, with Dawn Saunders Dahl and Christina Cuthbertson.
